

## Join the Georgia Tech Sounds Podcast in Spring 2015

Georgia Tech's Writing and Communication Program and the School of Literature, Media, and Communication are looking for talented students to develop and launch of a podcast about culture, diversity, community, and language at Georgia Tech. Tentatively titled *Georgia Tech Sounds*, the podcast will explore sounds that define the landscape and creative energy of Georgia Tech.

This spring, we will form a core team of students and faculty to establish the tone and thematic scope of the podcast, then plan, script, and record the inaugural episode, to launch with the arrival of new students for fall semester, 2015.

We are especially interested in students with an interest or experience in sound editing and production, broadcasting, and storytelling. Audiophiles and active community members are also welcome! Many team roles are available, including:

- o **Editor:** works with faculty leaders to manage student team, concepts, and writing
- o **Producer**: assists with recording and editing selected sounds
- o **Designer:** assists with podcast photography, art, and website design and maintenance
- o Community Liaison: connects with university community to solicit participation and ideas
- o **Resource Scout:** identifies locations and materials to realize the concept for each episode

Participating students should be able to commit up to three (3) hours a week to the planning and production of the new podcast. Opportunities exist for hands-on learning to make a public-facing, widely distributed podcast while collaborating with several campus units, including LMC, the library, WREK, and the Atlanta arts community.
